# What is Stormwater Runoff Pollution?

As it rains, the stormwater runs over streets, sidewalks, parking lots, and yards picking up pollutants such as grease, oil, brake fluid, garbage, and other contaminants. This untreated mix travels into the stormwater system via gutters, swales, ditches, and pipes and eventually ends up in a natural system like a wetland, lake, river, or the aquifer. Impervious (non-porous) surfaces increase the volume of stormwater. Saturated lawns from overwatering or heavy rain can act as an impervious surface.

## What can be done at home to reduce Stormwater Runoff Pollution?

- Properly dispose of household hazardous wastes. To see a complete list of hazardous waste items and find a facility near you, please visit [www.cwgdn.com](http://www.cwgdn.com).
- Fertilize responsibly by choosing not to overuse, especially near any water's edge. Also, choose fertilizer that does not include phosphate because Florida soil is naturally high in phosphorous. To learn more about what type of soil you have and the correct amount of fertilizer for your lawn, please visit [www.orangecountyfl.net](http://www.orangecountyfl.net).
- Pick up pet waste and dispose in the garbage or designated animal waste container. Pet waste may have a multitude of germs and harmful diseases. By leaving pet waste in the grass or sidewalk, it often makes its way through the stormwater system and into the natural waterways, causing significant water pollution.
- Avoid overwatering your lawn to prevent irrigation and rain water from flowing over landscaping, turf, and driveways while collecting fertilizer, herbicides, pesticides, grass clippings, pet waste, and petroleum products along the way.
- When it comes to pool water, avoid creating an adverse effect on local water quality by dechlorinating the water before discharging. Discharges made directly to the

environment should be targeted over a land surface so that some level of filtration by soil particles can occur.

- When mowing your lawn, detach the bag from off your lawn mower and let the clippings naturally fertilize with nitrogen through decomposition. If you bag the clippings, consider spreading them behind shrubs or add to a compost pile for the same decompositional benefits without the hassle of lugging heavy lawn bags around. If you choose to dispose of clippings, help keep the debris out of the streets and stormwater inlets by raking and bagging for scheduled yard trash pick-up.
- In addition to degrading water quality as the material degrades or spreads, trash can clog or block stormwater inlets and pipes, which can lead to flooding. Trash also harms aquatic life and wetland species either through ingestion or water quality degradation. Participating in scheduled trash and recycling pick-up will help prevent stormwater pollution.




